**Curbside Recycling**

Beginning the week of June 4th, once a week trash pickup and curbside recycling will start. Residents will have the following pickup schedule:



- Monday - Trash pickup for residents
- Tuesday - Trash pickup for Lou-Del & Country Club Hills residents
- Thursday - Recycling pickup for residents
- Friday - Recycling pickup for Lou-Del & Country Club Hills residents

Reliable Sanitation Service will provide each Waterloo resident with a 65 gallon recycling tote with a blue lid along with instructions on acceptable recyclables. Please be aware that the pickup schedule will change when a holiday falls within the week as detailed in the letter attached to your recycling tote. This letter is also posted on the Bulletin Board on the City’s website.

**Yard Waste Site**

The City of Waterloo occasionally must close the yard waste site in order to allow our employees time for grinding and chipping the debris. On these occasions it is necessary to CLOSE the site to the public to avoid any potential accidents. For your safety, please follow the signs as posted. When the site is closed, there is no dumping allowed until the site is reopened.

There has also been quite a bit of illegal dumping at our site. If you see anyone dumping any materials other than residential yard waste, we ask that you please contact the Police Department at 939-8651 or report their license plate number to City Hall at 939-8600.
