Backflow Preventer Inspection Reminder

If your property has a Swimming Pool or Lawn Trrigation System which is directly connected to the city's water supply, or Radiant or Steam Heat, and is required to have a Backflow Prevention Device, the annual inspection reports are due.

Reminder letters were recently mailed to those property owners who indicated in last year's survey they do have a Backflow Preventer. If you did not receive the letter or have since had a Backflow Preventer installed, please send a copy of your current Inspection Report to City Hall. Questions?
