When Storms Hit...

In light of last month's damaging storm, we would like to remind our residents of a few items. First, it's a good idea to always be prepared because all thunderstorms are dangerous. Build an emergency kit and make a family communications plan, remove dead or rotting trees and branches that could fall and cause injury or damage during a sever thunderstorm, secure outdoor objects that could blow away or cause damage and sign up for our CODE Red Emergency Notification System, so you will be aware when a dangerous storm is approaching. Also, the City of Waterloo will pick up limbs, but they must be placed curbside and you must call City Hall to be placed on a pick up list.
