Distracted Driving Awareness Week

Distracted drivers pose a deadly risk to everyone on the road. In 2009, the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration estimated that nearly 5,500 people lost their lives and another 448,000 were injured in police-reported crashes in which one form of distraction was noted on the crash report.

The Waterloo Police Department is participating in the first ever Illinois Distracted Driving Awareness Week, which will be held April 24-28, to help bring awareness to this problem that affects **YOU**. Excess Flow Valve Notification

The Pipeline and Hazardous Materials Safety Administrations has issued a new regulation that requires the City of Waterloo to offer an Excess Flow Valve (EFV) to its customers. An EFV is an optional safety device that can be installed on a natural gas service line to reduce the risk of a release of natural gas caused by excavation damage. The cost of installation will be the property owner's responsibility. For more information, please visit our website at www.waterloo.il.us.

April Showers bring...tall grass and drainage issues!

- All grass must be kept below a maximum height of 8".
- Trim bushes around your utility meters so your meters can be read accurately.
- The Waterloo yard waste site is available to city residents for tree limbs, branches, grass clippings and other yard waste. You may also get **free** mulch there!
- Do NOT put grass clippings or yard waste into trash/recycling totes.

Don't forget your drainage! Spring storms often leave behind water problems. Be proactive by cleaning out guttering, maintaining adequate foundation backfill that allows water to drain away from your home and clear any storm sewer inlets on your property. The City of Waterloo is **not** responsible for clearing debris from storm sewers on easements.
