WHEREAS, Mural Art is widely considered one of the oldest methods of artistic expression; and,

WHEREAS, the significance of Mural Art is not based on age, but it's ability to bring art into public places; and,

WHEREAS, while a sign specifically advertises a business, product or service through graphics or text, a mural is solely artistic in nature; and,

WHEREAS, Mural Art should be incorporated architecturally into the façade of the building on which it is placed in order to complement and enhance the structure; and,

WHEREAS, the City of Waterloo, Illinois has an interest in the beautification of the downtown area and wishes to adopt guidelines intended to provide mural applicants with a reasonable process that will safeguard the interest of the community, as well as those of the individual property owner.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WATERLOO, ILLINOIS:

- Section 1. The City of Waterloo, Illinois adopts the City of Waterloo Mural Guidelines Policy as attached hereto and incorporated herein.
- Section 2. This Resolution shall become effective immediately upon its passage and recording with the City of Waterloo, Illinois Office of the City Clerk.

CITY OF WATERLOO MURAL GUIDELINES

Mural art is widely considered one of the oldest methods of artistic expression. Its significance not based on age, but its ability to bring art into public places. Murals should complement and enhance the building and be incorporated architecturally into the façade. While a sign is specifically advertising a business, product or service through graphics or text, a mural is solely artistic in nature.

Mechanically-produced or computer generated prints or images, including but not limited to digitally printed vinyl are prohibited. Murals shall not contain electrical or mechanical components; changing image murals; commercial signage. shall be created with paint and or tile only.

For regularity purposes, hand-painted signs are not considered murals.

The mural application process and guidelines are intended to provide mural applicants with a reasonable process that will safeguard the interest of the community, as well as those of the individual property owner.

LOCATION

- 1. The installation of the mural should complement and enhance the building and be incorporated architecturally into the façade.
- 2. The location of the mural on the building should not cover or detract from significant or character-defining architectural features.
- 3. Murals should not be located in an area which may cause undue distraction to drivers therby creating a safety hazard.
- 4. Murals should be located in commercial areas.
- 5. To protect the integrity of historically significant structures, murals are not permitted on the primary façade of a historic building.

DESIGN

- 1. The scale of the mural should be appropriate to the building and the site.
- 2. The mural should be an original design; showcasing the uniqueness, sense of community, historical, patriotic, or highlights from Waterloo's past.
- 3. The artist's name(s) may be incorporated but should be discreet.
- 4. Paint utilized should be of superior quality and intended for exterior use only. Reflective, neon and fluorescent paints shall not be used.
- 5. The mural should have a waterproof seal coating.
- 6. Murals shall not contain electrical or mechanical components.

REVIEW

Submit the Mural Permit Application and required documents to the Zoning Administrator. Once the application is submitted an appointment with the Downtown Beatification Committee will be made for the initial review of imagry, location and medium.

All applications must include the following:

- 1. Complete Mural Permit Application
- 2. Brief description of the theme/image for this mural.
- 3. Photographs of the existing building and proposed mural area.
- 4. List of materials to be used.
- 5. Lead artist's qualifications and work sample.
- 6. Color scale rendering of the proposed mural design
- 7. Written permission including acknowledgment or responsibilities of the property owner.
- 8. Project timeline.

The committee's decision is based upon adopted review criteria for public art murals, readability and appropriateness of scale and materials; no signage or subject matter that could be construed as advertising or political messages.

If the mural proposal is not approved, the applicant may resubmit additional materials as requested. The applicant is not required to attend the meeting.

The following criteria shall be considered in the review of mural applications:

- (a) *Visual enhancement*. The proposed mural has attributes that enhance visual enjoyment.
- (b) Artistic excellence. The proposed mural exemplifies high artistic quality.
- (c) *Public safety*. The proposed mural does not create a public safety issue, such as a distraction to drivers.

ENFORCEMENT

- 1. Murals shall be completed within six (6) months of approval of the Downtown Beautification Committee. This period may be extended once by vote of the Downtown Beautification Committee.
- At the committee's discretion, incomplete projects that extend beyond the six
 (6) month installation period shall be required to cover the incompleted work with a solid paint color.
- 3. Any mural without approval shall be considered grafitti and enforced accordingly.
- 4. When an offical interpretation is deemed necessary to determine whether or not a proposal constitutes a sign and is thereby subject to the City's sign standards, the Zoning Adminstrator or his designee shall be responsible for making such an interpretation.
- 5. The Zoning Administrator or his designee's decision may be appealed to the Zoning Board of Appeals.

MAINTENANCE

- 1. The maintenance of the mural will be responsibility of the property owner.
- 2. The mural must be properly maintained to ensure that material failure (peeling paint) is corrected and vandalism removed promptly in accordance with the Property Maintenance Ordinance.

LEASE BY AND BETWEEN THE CITY OF WATERLOO, ILLINOIS, A MUNICIPAL CORPORATION ("LESSEE") AND WILLIAM AND TERESA HATLEY ("LESSORS")

- **LEASED** This lease made and entered into on the date of complete execution in 2017 by and between the Lessors, and the Lessee, WITNESSETH:
 - 1. Lessors hereby leases to Lessee. Lessee hereby rents from Lessor, the premises (a parking lot) located northeast of the intersection of Mill and Market Streets, Waterloo, Illinois bearing P.I.N. 07-25-236-016-000.
- **TERM** 2. This lease shall be for a term of one year commencing on May 1, 2017. All renewals shall be under the same terms and conditions as the original lease. This lease shall automatically renew for a one year term unless either party notifies the other party, in writing. sixty (60) days prior to termination, its intent to terminate the lease.

The lease commences on May1, 2017.
- **DEPOSIT** 4. Lessor acknowledges receipt of \$ 0.00 as a deposit from Lessee, to be held during the term of this lease, and any renewal thereof, as security for any possible structural damage, normal wear and tear excepted.

MAINT. AND REPAIR 5

AIR 5. Lessee agrees to maintain the leased premises in good, neat and sanitary order, condition and repair, and not to alter the same without written prior consent of Lessor.

DAMAGE TO

- BUILDING6. If the leased premises or the means of ingress or egress to or from said premises shall be damaged by fire or the elements, and be rendered unsuitable for use as a parking lot the lease shall end. Lessor has no responsibility to repair the premises.
- **INSURANCE** 7. Lessee shall provide the Lessor with a Certificate of Insurance naming the Lessor as Additional Insured.
- LIENS
 8. Neither Lessee or Lessor shall permit any lien or claim to be filed against the leased premises by reason of any work procured thereon by Lessee, utility charges, personal property taxes or other taxes or charges imposed on Lessee by governmental authority. Lessors shall be responsible for payment of real estate taxes.
- **UTILITIES** 9. All utility bills incurred in the leased premises throughout the duration of this lease or any renewal thereof shall be duly and timely paid by Lessee.
- SIGNS 10. Any sign or signs installed by Lessee shall require the prior consent of Lessor and shall be subject to the approval of any governmental authority having jurisdiction thereof and shall be removed by Lessee upon termination or cancellation of this lease, and Lessee shall repair all damages incidental to such removal.
- ASSIGNMENT 11. Lessee may not assign this lease.

DEFAULT

BY LESSEE 12. In case Lessee shall be in default in the payment of annual rental installments provided for herein or in case Lessee shall fail or refuse to perform or comply with any of the covenants and agreements of Lessee

contained herein, and if such default shall continue for a period of fifteen days after Lessee is so notified in writing by letter through certified or registered mail addressed to Lessee then Lessor, its agents or attorneys shall have the right to reenter and take possession therefore of the premises and remove all persons therefrom and the goods and chattels of all said persons without any liability or law or equity for any damages caused by such removals, and all cost and expenses incurred by Lessor on account of same shall be paid by Lessee. Upon re-entry, Lessor may relet premises as agent of Lessee for the remainder of the term for the account of Lessee, and Lessee shall remain liable for the rental as agreed hereunder, less the proceeds of reletting, if any, and shall pay the same, plus the expense of re-entry by Lessor as previously provided. If Lessor shall acquire possession of the premises or any part thereof by summary proceedings, or by any other action or judicial proceeding, or in any lawful manner with judicial proceedings, it shall be deemed a re-entry within the meaning of that word as used in this lease.

WAIVER OF BREACH

- 13. No waiver or default or breach of any term, covenant or condition herein shall be implied from any omission by either party to take action against the other on accountthereof if such default or breach continues or is repeated, and no express waiver shall affect any default or breach other than that specified and then only for the time and to the extent specified.
- **LITIGATION** 14. In the event any suit is brought by either party against the other to enforce any of the terms or provisions of this lease, then it is agreed that the successful party in such suit shall be entitled to reasonable attorney fees to be fixed by the court in such action. Jurisdiction for such litigation shall be in the Circuit Court of Monroe County, Illinois.

RETURN OF PREMISES

15. At the end of the term or any renewal thereof or upon termination of this lease, Lessee shall surrender the premises in as good order and condition as when received, damage from the elements, fire, acts of God or othercasualty excepted.
