On the second night of each route, the route will be reversed to give young children that may live at the end of the route a chance to visit Santa. The float departs at 5pm each evening and will be led by a City of Waterloo vehicle with red and green flashing lights, so you know Santa is close by!

# **SNOW REMOVAL POLICY**

The goal of the Waterloo Public Works Department is to provide snow and ice control in a safe, timely and cost-efficient manner. Below are a few highlights of the City's Snow Removal Policy and how residents can help:

- Please park your vehicle off-street whenever you can. Reminder: Recreational vehicles (campers, trailers, motor homes, boats, etc.) are not permitted to park on city streets at any time.
- Please make sure that basketball hoops and other obstructions are not placed in or adjacent to the street.
- Attempts will be made to keep excessive amounts of snow from accumulating at the end of driveways or in front of mailboxes. However, this is a reality of snow plowing and cannot be helped at times. Property owners are responsible for cleaning their driveway approaches and around mailboxes.
- The City is not responsible for plowing alleys.

# COLD WEATHER TIPS FOR YOUR HOME

- Check sprinkler or irrigations systems. Make sure you've turned everything off and fully drained the system.
- Identify your home's freezing points. These include pipes in crawl spaces, unheated rooms, basements, garages and exterior walls. Where pipes are exposed to cold, wrap them with insulation or heat tape.
- Know how to shut off your water. Locate your main water shut-off valve and mark it.
